WHO ARE WE?

The **vision** for New Creation Teaching Ministry was given at a weekend meeting of twenty-one people at Victor Harbor in South Australia, in January 1973. In June that year, **Geoffrey Bingham** (1919–2009)—experienced Bible teacher, Anglican minister, husband and father, former soldier and prisoner of war, farmer and writer, missionary and founder-principal of the Pakistan Bible Institute—with his wife Laurel left the Adelaide Bible Institute, where he had been principal, to implement this God-given vision of **wider communication of the gospel** in Australia and beyond. Experiences of genuine revival had left him with an indelible impression of what true faith and life can be.

New Creation Teaching Ministry began in a borrowed farmhouse at nearby Mount Compass, with a second-hand duplicator, and has grown into the present-day site at **Coromandel East** in the hills south of Adelaide with a fully equipped teaching centre, library, publication, sales and administration facilities, and a print room, along with the Pennicooks' home and ministry base in **Bowral**, New South Wales.

Christ supplies the **gifts of people-in-ministry** that are needed for the Church's life and growth: 'The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ' (Ephesians 4:11–12). In New Testament times, while some of these were stationed in particular local churches, many of them moved among the churches. New Creation Teaching Ministry is a **movement of such ministries** among the churches. As such, it is not a church itself, nor is it a 'para-church organisation'. It is part of the ministry supplied by Christ to his church.

A few people, each active in their own denomination, make up the **team**, whose main ministry is through New Creation, in speaking, administering, and in publishing and distributing recorded and printed resources. None of them is paid a salary or stipend—their support, along with the development of facilities and equipment, has come from the hand of God through the unsolicited gifts of God's people. The team is joined by numbers of others who exercise pastoral ministry in local churches, and a range of volunteer **helpers**.

A **Council** meets quarterly to oversee and handle the affairs of the group. There is provision in its constitution for New Creation Teaching Ministry to be wound up at any time and its assets transferred to some similar ministry or charitable object. It will continue as long as God sustains and furthers this ministry, for the benefit of many, and to His glory.

WHAT DO WE PROCLAIM AND TEACH?

- The apostolic gospel of the grace of God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit
- centred on the cross of Christ
- as ‘the whole purpose of God’ from the beginning to the end of the Scriptures
- with a view to the ultimate community of God with His people.

This is brought through prophetically to all who will hear, as a life-giving and life-sustaining Word, by the activity of the Spirit of God.

We proclaim Christ, ‘warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ . . . until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ’ (Colossians 1:28; Ephesians 4:13).

DOCTRINAL STANCE

The ‘Objects’ outlined in the Inaugural Meeting Minutes and the Constitution make it clear that NCPI–NCTM believe in the authority of Scripture for faith and practice. We therefore hold to the historic Creeds of the Church known as Apostles’, Nicene and Athanasian. Our doctrine is biblical and Reformed, without prejudice to the movements of God’s Spirit which come at times of revival and renewal of the Church. Whilst recognising these and wishing to share in them as they follow the truth, we do not feel bound to accept theological rationalisations of any movement or group. We believe that a full-orbed theology must be Trinitarian, and that whilst theology is not the truth itself, it can deeply affect—for good or not—the approach of man to truth, that is, to God Himself.

THE ‘NEW CREATION’ SYMBOL

‘In accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness dwells’ (2 Peter 3:13). ‘If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!’ (2 Corinthians 5:17).

The symbol that accompanies the New Creation resources highlights the full-orbed theology needed to sustain us in all the issues of life:



- The vertical cross is the cross of Christ
- The diagonal cross, the ‘Chi’, is the symbol of Christ himself
- The small circle is the initial creation
- The larger circle is the new creation

PREACHING AND TEACHING MISSIONS

The Church's primary purpose is to **proclaim the gospel**—the Word of the cross—the power of God for salvation (see Romans 1:16; 1 Corinthians 1:18), by which God in His grace brings guilty human beings into the peace and freedom of forgiveness and justification. This brings them under Christ's Lordship, and makes them to be part of Christ's community, the Church.

Since 1973, New Creation Teaching Ministry has held **preaching and teaching missions**, at the invitation of local churches and Christian communities, in every State of Australia, conducted by teams of evangelists, pastors and teachers, with musicians and other helpers.

Speakers are drawn from the New Creation team members—Ian Pennicook in New South Wales, Martin Bleby and Andrew Klynsmith in South Australia—and from others in pastoral ministry associated with us, with the encouragement of their local churches. **Support** in music, and helping to arrange publicity, published resources and transport, also comes from members of the team and other Christian believers.

We look to go where there is **an invitation and a welcome** from a local support base (as in Matthew 10:11–14; Acts 16:15). We do not seek to set up our own initiatives, or to grow ourselves as an organisation. Subject to the Spirit of God (as in Acts 16:6–10), we look to go where an apostolic, prophetic, evangelistic, pastoral teaching ministry of the Word is sought and welcomed, wherever that may take us, in places of whatever size or distance away.

We come to **work with and encourage local ministries** of the Word and worship. Where possible, we prefer to work with a number of churches in an area, across the denominations, or where a particular church is seeking to break new ground and needs help with that. The theme for the mission is chosen in consultation with the local church from a broad range of possibilities.

Preaching and teaching missions can take a variety of forms:

- a **weekend** of sessions from Friday evening, over Saturday, to preaching in various churches on the Sunday morning, and possibly into Sunday afternoon and evening;
- such a **weekend** that is **prepared for** by preaching in churches the previous Sunday, and home and community groups **during the week**;

PREACHING AND TEACHING MISSIONS cont.

- a spread of meetings over a **week** or **two-week period**;
- (for places closer to Adelaide and Sydney) a **series of Sundays** and/or **weekdays/nights**.

Attention needs to be given to whether the primary focus in a particular mission is to reach out to not-yet-believers, or to build up and equip believers in local churches for their mission and ministry.

Our desire is for the saving of the lost, the refreshing of God's people, and the renewing of our community in Christ. Missions do not accomplish this simply by happening. We are in the battle for the souls of men and women, and the Word will not be uncontested. Missions need to be surrounded by prayer to God that He would work His ever-new work of grace in the particular situation and time of the mission.

Themes from Thessalonians *Grant Thorpe*

What do new believers need to know when their life is being contested by hostile neighbours and evil powers? They, together with all believers, have been inducted into a new order of love and purity where everything is being directed by God's call and enabled by Christ's action. Paul clarifies these things for us all, and encourages us to please God, to be expecting his Son's return, to love one another 'more and more' and to 'keep awake' to the salvation that has been given to us.

The Mystery of Suffering *Neil McIntosh*

Not the 'problem' of suffering, but a 'mystery', that we never get to the end of in this life, by which God encounters us in life-changing ways.

The Story of God (New Testament) *Keith Chessell*

Salvation history—the unique story of human life with God, the Creator, Redeemer and eternal heavenly Father, who in Jesus Christ has fulfilled all that He purposed and promised.

The Story of Salvation *Andrew Klynsmith*

An interactive overview of the whole Bible, helping to supply a reliable framework for faith in God, especially for younger believers and enquirers.

Galatians *Noel Due*

The gospel and false gospels, how we are justified, Christ crucified, the curse and the blessings, the law and the promises, faith, adoption, living by the Spirit, restoring transgressors—all this and more is in Paul the apostle's Letter to the Galatians.

Creation and the Liberating Glory *Trevor Faggotter*

True knowledge of creation helps us to be at home with God in all that He has made. Without it we are adrift in the universe. The battle for the creation will issue in new heavens and a new earth.

Acts of the Apostles *Martin Bleby*

In this treatment we see the Acts of the Apostles as a crucial stage in the whole purpose and action of God. We are still in the unfolding of this action!

Marriage *Andrew Klynsmith*

Marriage is more than just a convenient arrangement between a man and a woman—wonderful, or difficult, as that might be. It is designed to reflect and participate in the ultimate marriage between Christ and his people!

God and Prayer *Martin Bleby*

Can we say that God has called human creatures to be, through prayer, nothing less than God's fellow-workers in all that God is doing? Where must we be, and what must we know, to be able to pray in this way?

Called by God *Grant Thorpe*

God changes everything for sinners by setting His love on them and calling them to Himself and into his gracious purpose. This calling and election is a problem to the human mind, but when someone turns to Jesus Christ and sees that he has been given up to death for their sins, they know God's will, not just in general, but for themselves in particular. Their life is then directed from eternity and to eternity and can be lived with wonderful certainty.

A Story of Fire *Bryce Clark*

Positive effects of the power of God in the lives and communities of Aboriginal Christians in Australia, as the Holy Spirit moves with the fire of the gospel.

CHRISTIAN WORKERS' COURSE

The **Christian Workers' Course** helps church members to better understand their faith and its practice—to equip them to become Christian workers with a good knowledge of the Old and New Testaments, Christian Doctrine, and Christian Life and Ministry.

The Course receives no accreditation recognised by outside bodies, and attracts no government funding. It is a training course that can help Christians in their ministry in and through their local church. It could also help to prepare any who may wish to undergo further training in other places of learning.

The course can be undertaken in a number of ways, which can be combined:

1. **Correspondence Subjects**, as detailed in the enrolment form,
2. **Weekly Classes**, as offered in the yearly program, with set assignments,
3. **Schools**, as offered each year: Summer, Winter, Spring or Ministry School, with set assignments,
4. **Study Materials**, in the form of books or notes and mp3 CDs or cassettes from the Tape Catalogue, with set assignments.

A **Personal Tutor** is provided for each subject. A **Subject Certificate** is issued at the completion of each subject, and a **Course Certificate** is awarded once the required number of units has been gained. Contact us for more details, and for advice in setting up your course.

In the Apostolic age the gospel was proclaimed in such a way that willing listeners grasped ‘the whole counsel of God’ and responded. Intellectual brilliance is not required to know the truth of God and to live in it. Father, Son and Holy Spirit lead us into all the truth. We seek in our teaching and learning to follow this ‘**prophetic principle**’ as teachers and listeners come under the Word of God. What we learn springs directly from the Scriptures as our way and rule of life, and the living truth of Scripture helps us in approaching the contemporary scene. We see our teaching as bringing us into interpersonal relationships with the Triune God, with the community of Christ—the Church—and with the general community.

RESOURCES

From its beginnings the New Creation Teaching Ministry has sought to use God-given technologies to communicate the gospel of God as widely as possible—from cassette tapes to mp3 CDs, from duplicated notes to books, from video tapes to DVDs, from word-of-mouth to the internet. New Creation resources are made available at cost or in some cases free, to ensure widespread distribution.

Audio and Video Recordings



Practically everything that has been taught through New Creation Teaching Ministry since it began in 1973—in Short-term Bible Schools, Missions, Monthly Studies and Weekly Classes, Gospel Nights, Revival Meetings, Summer, Winter, Spring and Ministry Schools, and other occasional Gatherings—has been recorded and is available, either on audio cassette tape or in mp3 format. These range from thematic studies, such as *The Cross of Christ*, *God Our Father*, and *God's People in History*, and systematic theology, as in the *Living Faith Studies*, through to individual books of the Bible, and more personal teaching, as in the *Tapes for Life* series.

Major teaching occasions and conferences such as Summer Schools and Ministry Schools have been recorded on video, giving the added visual stimulus, especially useful for group study. They are available on VHS tape or on DVD. Some, such as the 1985 Summer School on 'The Power and Preaching of the Cross', are in constant demand.

The Printed Word



Notes are made available in connection with many of the classes, schools and studies. Often the teaching given is then consolidated into book form, which can be used together with recordings of the spoken word. Further reflection has also given rise to essays, poetry, short stories and novels.

Over 400 titles have been published by New Creation, with some reprinted a number of times, covering a wide range of subjects:

- Simple booklets such as the ‘Comprehending’ and ‘Christian Teaching’ series
- Major theological works such as *The Day of the Spirit* and *The Law of Eternal Delight*

Music



Out of the teaching and worship associated with New Creation have come many new songs. 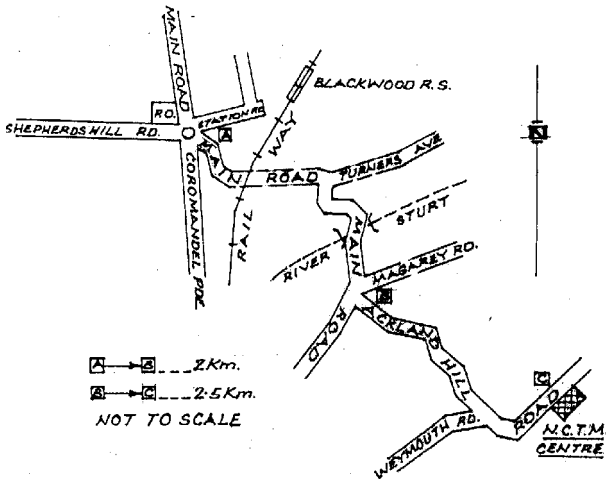
The New Creation Library

Andrew has been a speaker for many years with a desire to spread the Good News. Liz is part of the publications team and caters at classes and schools.

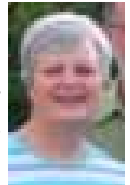


Bob and Robin Pickering
